Our Schools

There are six schools conveniently located throughout the City of Portales. Each of our schools is a grade level school. Until a student reaches high school, there are no more than two grade levels in each of our schools.

Brown Early Childhood Center—Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten R.M. James Elementary School---First and Second Grades Valencia Elementary School---Third and Fourth Grades Lindsey-Steiner Elementary School---Fifth and Sixth Grades Portales Junior High School---Seventh and Eighth Grades Portales High School---Ninth through Twelfth Grades

Our grade level schools are different from the community schools that you might find in other cities, but there are several advantages that our grade level schools offer. Each of these schools are diverse. Children from across the District attend the same school as their grade level peers. Like a small rural school, students in the Portales District grow up together. They know each other from the time they enter school until they graduate. When students enter junior high or high school, unlike community schools that might feed to a larger junior high or high school, our students all come from the same sixth grade school. They already know each other and this makes the transition much easier. In our grade level schools, teachers have an exceptional opportunity for collaboration and working together to ensure that all students receive comparable instruction and all students have access to the same equipment, libraries, textbooks, etc. At our schools, you can rest assured that no matter where you live, your children have access to the same educational opportunities as every other child in the District.

All of our schools feature state of the art technology, and we are upgrading and purchasing new equipment every year to help our students and teachers have the tools they need for this technological age and to compete with others in this global economy. Even though we do have great technology in our schools, we still provide traditional instruction and our teachers are here for our students and ready to build strong and lasting relationships to help your children succeed.

We offer after-school tutoring at all of our schools. At the high school and junior high school, we also have tutors assigned to several of our math classes to provide additional assistance as

needed during the school day. This year, we will offer *Near Peer tutoring* at some of our elementary schools. *Near Peer tutors* are high school seniors who go through a hiring process and training that ensures they have the skills to tutor elementary students. These tutors will work in the elementary schools tutoring students as needed. The District offers after-school enrichment classes for all grade levels. These classes are a variety of programs to catch the interest of everyone. Portales High School offers credit recovery through our online school with after-school teacher support. The more non-traditional students who prefer to work on their own at their own pace or people who have been out of school for a while and want to return for a diploma may also find the online school a perfect fit. Teacher support is available for everyone enrolled in the online school.

Portales High School offers your child many opportunities that he or she might not have available in a smaller school, or a larger school for that matter. The high school is large enough to offer many different educational opportunities and a great number of extracurricular and co-curricular activities that will help to prepare your child for life after high school. The school is also small enough to help ensure that he or she may not have to choose between different activities in which to become involved. At Portales High School your child can be in band and a member of the volleyball or football team, he or she can participate in a play and still participate in sports or MESA or any of our other extracurricular activities.

I am very proud of this school district and the people who make it a great place to live and educate our children. We have great and caring teachers and staff who will work with you and your children to make their education an enjoyable experience. Some of the Exciting Programs Offered at Portales High School

- Honors classes in English I, II, & III; Geometry; Algebra II; Biology; Chemistry; United States History; World History; Government; and Economics. (Students must qualify to enroll.)
- Dual Credit Classes with Eastern New Mexico University, Clovis Community College, and Mesalands Community College. (Several dual credit courses are taught at Portales High School, some are taught at ENMU or CCC. Many of our students leave Portales High School with well over 12 hours of college credit and there is no cost to parents or students. Dual credit courses also fulfill high school credit requirements.)
- Media Arts. (This program is a series of course that can begin in 9th grade and progress through the senior year. The program also offers dual credit. This program offers state of the art video and computer equipment that allows students to learn how to create video productions through filming/videoing, editing, scripting, etc. Students live stream athletic events, school productions, and other community events. This program can lead to a career in television or advertising and provides a solid background for college television production.)
- FFA (Includes leadership training, public speaking, parliamentary procedure, career development event instruction and contests. Although traditionally thought of as only an agriculture class, the program offers training and skills that can be useful for any profession.)
- Family Consumer Science (The kitchen and classroom have been remodeled to include residential kitchens and a commercial type kitchen. Students may join Family, Career, and Community Leaders of America (FCCLA). FCCLA is a dynamic and effective national student organization that helps young men and women become leaders and address important personal, family, work and societal issues through family and consumer sciences education. The program also offers District, State and National competitions.)
- MESA (Mathematics, Engineering, Science Achievement. This program offers instruction and competition in computer programming, robotics, and other engineering related activities.)
- Student Council

- Educators Rising (An organization for students who want to pursue a career in education.)
- Business Professionals of America (Business Professionals of America is the premier CTSO (Career and Technical Student Organization) for students pursuing careers in business management, office administration, information technology and other related career fields.)
- Welding (Students learn basic and advanced methods of welding and build projects. This is a good prerequisite to students who wish to enroll in a vocational welding program after high school.)

- Western Art and Engraving. (This course teaches metal engraving and the art of building quality belt buckles, spurs, bits, and jewelry.)
- Drama Club (Although we offer several classes in theatre and set design, a student does not need to be in a theatre class to join Drama Club. The Drama Club participates in state competitions and performs at least one major production for the community.)
- Choir (Our choir is an award winning choir that performs for the community at least twice each year and at many special events throughout the year. State Champion Choir 2016, 2018, 2019, 2022 &2023. (No state competitions were held in 2020 or 2021.)
- Band (Offers marching band that performs at football games and in parades as well as concert band. They hold at least two formal community performances and special events throughout the year. Band instruction is offered beginning in 5th grade. The band also completes in State competitions and out of state competitions and is consistently one of the top in our classification.)
- Basketball (Boys' and Girls' Freshman, Junior Varsity, and Varsity teams. Our boys were the District Champions in 2017 and the State Class 4A Runner-up. Our girls were the State Champions in 2014 & 2018, and Runners-up in 2015.)
- Volleyball (Girls' Freshman, Junior Varsity, and Varsity teams.)
- Football (Freshman, Junior Varsity, and Varsity teams. Class 4A State Champions, 2016.)
- Cheer (High School cheerleading for football, volleyball, basketball and Cheer competition.)
- Track and Field (Boys' and Girls' teams. The boys were New Mexico State Class 4A runners-up in 2017.)
- Baseball (Freshman team that also allows for 8th grade participation, Junior Varsity, and Varsity Teams. Class 4A State Champions, 2017.)
- Softball (Fast pitch softball. Eighth grade students may participate. Junior Varsity and Varsity.)
- Soccer (Boys' and Girls' Junior Varsity and Varsity Teams, eighth graders may join.)
- Golf (Boys' and Girls' Golf Teams. Eighth grade students may participate. Boys' golf team was 2017 State 4A co-champions and State Champions in 2018.)
- Tennis (Boys' and Girls' Teams. Eighth grade students may participate.)
- Cross Country (Boys and Girls: New sport added Fall of 2018. Eighth grade students may participate.)
- Power Lifting (This was a new sport for the 2022-2023 school year with a State Champion lifter. Open to high school students.
- e-Sports (Offered to high school and eighth grade students. State runners-up last year and State Champion in two separate games.)

- Honors classes in 7th and 8th grade English Language Arts; 8th Grade Science; and Algebra I (Students must qualify to enroll.)
- MESA (Mathematics, Engineering, Science Achievement) This program offers instruction and competition in computer programming, robotics, and other engineering related activities.)

- Family and Consumer Sciences (Students may join Family, Career, and Community Leaders of America (FCCLA) Family, Career and Community Leaders of America is a dynamic and effective national student organization that helps young men and women become leaders and address important personal, family, work and societal issues through family and consumer sciences education. The program also offers District, State and National competitions.)
- FFA (Includes leadership training, public speaking, opening ceremony, CTE instruction and contests. Although traditionally thought of as only an agriculture class, the program offers training and skills that can be useful for any profession.)
- Woodshop (Students learn how to use woodworking equipment and build several projects throughout the course including pens and lamps.)
- Art (Students learn to be creative with their minds and their hands and create several projects during the course.)
- Media Arts (This course teaches students how to use video and computer equipment to tape and edit performances, commercials, athletic events, etc. It is a good preparatory course for the high school Media Arts program.)
